Andrew St. John is an associate at Hagens Berman Sobol Shapiro's Phoenix office where he has worked since 2004. During his undergraduate education, Mr. St. John interned at the Governor's office during the 1998 regular and emergency legislative sessions. Mr. St. John was awarded a commendation by Governor Hull for his dedication and tireless service.

Mr. St. John earned his juris doctorate at the Sandra Day O'Connor School of Law, with high pro bono Distinction. While in law school, Mr. St. John competed in moot court competitions, served as a staff writer on the Arizona State Law Journal, externed for both U.S. District Court Judge Paul G.
